The information provided will be maintained in a database and its contents kept and updated by the Keeper of Emergency Information who shall be appointed annually and will be one of the two Directors at Large. We recommend residents who are currently in the database that you review your information to see if it needs to be updated.

ITEM FOR BOARD ACTION

Recommend change to Architectural Review Committee Guidelines. Roofing manufacturers have changed the names of the colors of their shingles making it necessary for us to update the colors of the pre-approved shingles in the guidelines. The correct colors are:

ELK/GAF Architectural 25 yr. – Charcoal
Owens-Corning – Architectural 30 yr. Onyx Black
Landmark CertainTeed – Architectural 30 yr. Charcoal Black
IKO 40 yr. Architectural – Dual Black
Decra Metal Shingles – Charcoal Stone Coated

GATES AND DECALS

Fifteen years ago when Myrtle Ridge Road was paved it became clear to our community that we needed to prevent non-residents from using Myrtle Trace Drive as a cut through and shortcut to avoid traffic on Route 501. The system of gates and car decals has served us well and keeps most of that non-resident traffic off our roads. However we are required to allow emergency vehicles to pass through the gates. Our gates are designed to respond to sirens and will go up and stay up for 15 minutes at the sound of an approaching siren – whether it be fire, ambulance or police. We have discovered that the gates will also respond to noise similar to sirens like back up beeping on large trucks, leaf blowers, etc. Please don't be alarmed if you see the gates in the up position and don't assume that something is wrong with them. Once the noise has passed the gates will resume normal operation.

However, what if you approach the gate in your vehicle and the gates do not go up?? The problem may very well be your decal. The decals are guaranteed for 5 years with normal wear and tear. Many of our residents have had the same car and same decal for 14 years and have had no trouble getting in and out of the gates. Others have had to have the original decal removed and replaced due to sun and/or water damage, or because they have removed the decal from a former vehicle and put it on a new car and it doesn't work well. Remember – when you get a new car, get a new decal. And if you have trouble getting the gates to respond, call Nancy Seeds at 843-347-6615 and arrange to get a new decal.

WHERE IS YOUR MAIN WATER SHUT OFF?

Myrtle Trace will celebrate its 40th birthday in 2023. But 40 years is a long time for valves and pipes. Plants, grass and shifting sands may hide the water shut off to our homes and allow leaks to do extensive damage. If you are not sure of the location of your water shut off valve Grand Strand Water and Sewer will assist you.

During regular business hour (8AM – 5PM M-F) contact GSW&S customer service department: 843-443-8200. Customer service will help locate your cutoff from a system map. If you are unable to locate the cutoff after this step, GSW&S will dispatch a service team during business hours.

If you encounter a problem outside of normal business hours, GSW&S will dispatch a team to locate and cut off the water. However, a service charge of \$75.00 will apply for the emergency call.

Residents that have signed up for line maintenance will not pay a service charge for after hour dispatch. GSW&S offers line maintenance for a monthly charge. The line maintenance monthly fee is \$2.80. The line maintenance plan covers the water and sewer line from the street to the exterior of the home and also covers repairs to sidewalks, driveways, shrubbery and other landscaping features. The Coordinator represents and acknowledges that she/he is an independent contractor and not an employee of the Association. As such the Coordinator shall provide at his/her own expense and on his/her premises, the equipment and software for the performance of the agreed services of compiling the directory. The copy machine, copy paper and staples will be provided by the Association.

The Coordinator will provide orientation, training and relevant updating relative to his/her responsibilities to an individual(s) designated by the Board of Directors.

This agreement may be terminated, without cause, upon 30 days written notice by both party; and the Directory Coordinator shall not assign this Agreement without the express written consent of the Association.

Interested parties should submit a letter and/or resume to the Association outlining qualifications. The letter/resume should be to the attention of Nancy Seeds and placed in the Homeowners slot at the Clubhouse **no later than Friday, February 10, 2023**.
