PROPERTY COMMITTEE

CARE AND MAINTENANCE OF HOA PROPERTY: During the non-growing season, the Hardee Maintenance crew are working on erecting retaining walls for our ponds and other assignments.

During the growing season, they are out mowing, blowing the roadways, laying sod, feeding and fertilizing the HOA grass, etc.

Debris is picked up **after a named storm** and the homeowner has 4 days to gather branches, twigs and other debris.

HOMEOWNER FORMS: Should a homeowner request to mow, fertilize and feed their own lawn, the forms to apply are available in the Clubhouse to the right of the telephone in a hanging bin. After filling out, write on the envelope or on top of the form: ATT: BOARD. The forms are given to the Board and they will either approve your request or deny with an explanation. Once you are given permission, should you decide at any time that you would like to return to the Association caring for the HOA lawn, you may request so in writing. You may not again apply for a Maintenance Agreement. In any case, the residing resident must water all lawns.

MTHOA BOARD MEETINGS

The Board meets regularly the third Wednesday of each month at the Clubhouse at 9am and all residents are welcome and encouraged to attend and participate. One of the first things on a new Board's agenda is agreement to Standard Operating Procedures for our meetings. This year we have also adopted operating procedures for the first half hour of each meeting which is dedicated to resident participation. The purpose of resident participation is to give residents an opportunity to make the Board aware of issues they would like the Board to consider or to express a viewpoint concerning Board business. The Board will listen to the 5 minute presentation and will take the time to consider the issues and respond at a later time. In cases of abusive or vulgar language, profanity, threatening remarks or comments of purely personal attacks on residents or board members, the Chair will rule the person out of order and require her/him to relinquish the floor. We ask that anyone who wants to bring an issue to the attention of the Board at the meeting send a request to the Board President stating the issue(s) they wish to address. These guidelines have been adopted to ensure the comfort and integrity of all present.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

In Myrtle Trace we care about one another. Unfortunately, as a retirement community we are seen by some as "easy targets". We have had a number of cars in our area rifled while parked in the driveway. We have contacted the local police and they are aware of the situation and recommend the following: Have a routine for closing up your residence at night and stick to it. Lock your car, close your garage door, lock all doors, leave a porch light or garage light on, and should you have an incident or see something suspicious, **call the non-emergency police number: 843-248-1520. If we call, the police will patrol more often.** Thanks to Ann Golden and the Neighborhood Watch committee for *helping to keep this a safe community.*

BOARD BUSINESS

We made a number of decisions at our first Board meeting of 2023. We appointed two new independent contractors:

Carol Blonowicz will be the new NEWSLETTER COORDINATOR and will take over that job from Ted Ackley who has retired from that position after serving this community for 20 some years.

Nancy Southard is the new DIRECTORY COORDINATOR and will maintain a database of resident information to be published in the community telephone directory twice a year. She also will be learning from Ted Ackley how to compile, print and distribute the Directory.

We officially accepted the recommendation of the ARC to amend their guidelines regarding the names of roof shingle colors since they have been changed by the manufacturer. Information on roof replacement is available through the Architectural Review Committee, and remember, any changes to the exterior of your residence begins with ARC.

We ask you to help us comply with our Covenants which require the Association to keep a record of resident Homeowner Insurance to assure that all of our residences are insured to full replacement cost. Our homeowners supply the information and a separate flier and further explanation is enclosed in this issue of News & Views for your convenience.

Let's hope for an early Spring in spite of the pollen!

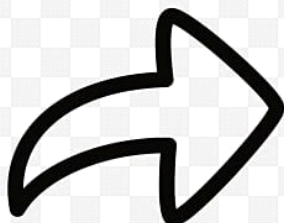
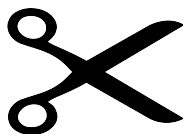
