BOARD BRIEFS

Items for Board Action – Proposed changes to MYRTLE TRACE HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION BOARD/GENERAL POLICIES

Capital Contribution (“Lot Deposit”)

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Myrtle Trace Homeowners Association, Inc. has determined that the cost of providing and maintaining the improvements for which the lot deposit was imposed has increased substantially.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AND IS HEREBY RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Whereas, on the resale of a residential unit in the Myrtle Trace community the purchaser is henceforth to be charged a fee of \$1,450.00 “lot fee” deposit; \$100 will be considered the purchaser’s Certificate Assessment Fee.
2. And, as such, \$1,550 will be considered the purchaser’s contribution for his, her, their use of the improvements to the Common Properties. Such fee is payable to the Myrtle Trace Homeowners Association, Inc. at the time of closing on the sale of the unit and shall be identified as “Capital Contribution”.

Proposed changes to MYRTLE TRACE HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION – COMMON PROPERTIES GUIDELINES AND RESTRICTIONS FOR HOMEOWNERS

Section I. Facilities Use Policy

A signed contract plus a \$100.00 returnable deposit payable to the MTHOA must be given to the Calendar Person prior to the function. The deposit will be returned as soon as it can be determined that the users have complied with the clean-up guidelines. A non-returnable fee of \$50 is required to defray costs incurred by facility use.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

PINE TREE ALERT—Last month a couple of Loblolly pine trees died on Loblolly Lane. In just a few days several other pines turned brown (died) next to the first 2 trees that died. The resident and the Property committee hired a contractor to remove the trees that died from private and common property. Our concern being these trees succumbed to a type of pine bark beetle that can kill whole stands of pine trees in short order. Removing infected trees is the best solution to deal with this type of pest. They will kill one tree and move to adjacent trees (if close).

We brought in an expert from the state forest service to determine if the pest is still around. Fortunately, there is no evidence they are still present. The trees are most susceptible when they are under stress. This summer we had one of the driest Julys in years followed by 10 inches of rain in a few days in August. This is not the best condition for the trees but is not something we can control.

I ask all residents if you see a pine tree whose needles suddenly start turning yellow or brown especially the top of the tree and/or globs of sap coming out of the trunk (looks like popcorn) to notify your property phase rep. We have access to experts who can provide guidance on what is the cause and how to proceed.

One of the most common reasons people say for moving to Myrtle Trace is the mature stands of trees. We want to do what we can to preserve this asset.

The Board reminds all homeowners that Article VI, Section 5 of the Covenants requires each homeowner to maintain insurance for each property. **At the present time, less than 50% of Myrtle Trace homeowners have a valid proof of insurance form on file.** Evidence of insurance for both new policies and renewals should be provided to Debi Perry, Administrative Consultant for Myrtle Trace. You may also complete the form included with this issue, and return it to Debi as soon as possible.

* **INHERITED HOMES—INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS**

Anyone who has inherited a Myrtle Trace home should be aware that the previous homeowner's insurance policy does not automatically transfer to you even in the case of a policy paid in full for an entire year. Insurance companies have their own procedures. The Board recommends that beneficiaries contact the insurance company for directions. Remember, insurance coverage is required, and we are still in hurricane season, 2024.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH - EMERGENCY KIT CHECKLIST

With the recent hurricane damages and constant information coming from the Weather Channel and local weather sources, it was strongly brought to viewers' attention this key question: **Do you have a family emergency evacuation kit ready when needed?**

Here is a list of some necessary items needed in an emergency or evacuation situation as recommended by the South Carolina Emergency Management Division (SCEMD):

Keep enough supplies in your home to meet the needs of your family for at least three days whether you stay or leave for a shelter.

- ◆ **WATER:** two gallons per person per day for at least 3 days.
- ◆ **FOOD:** non-perishable food for 3 days.
- ◆ **FIRST AID KIT/MEDICINES:** plan to have all prescription medications for a month and don't forget your glasses.
- ◆ **CELL PHONE & CHARGERS.**
- ◆ **NOAA Weather Radio** or a hand crank radio that can charge your cell phones.
- ◆ **PET FOOD:** canned or bag, plus water. Don't forget to bring a can opener.
- ◆ **FAMILY EMERGENCY CONTACT LIST:** leave a list of your contact details on your fridge if you leave & carry the same on you should you leave your house.
- ◆ **CASH, TRAVELERS CHECKS, COINS:** if the electricity is down, credit cards won't work!

NOVEMBER LAWN CARE TIP

Avoid overwatering your lawn at this point in the year. Too much water can cause damage that may be hard to correct in the next growing season.

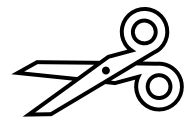

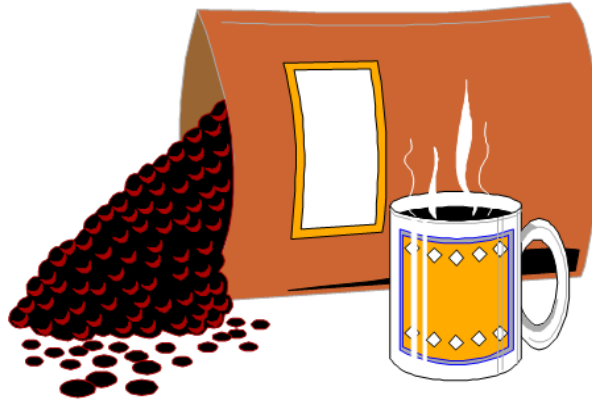
